However, I want you to understand clearly that your student will be exposed to much material that is going to argue persuasively on topics that are contrary to conservative Christian beliefs. While I do not like having to deal with this material, I do believe that exposure to this material in a contained, protective environment will help the students develop as Christian students who filter everything through a Biblical worldview. However, I do not want this goal to gloss over the objectionable elements in these books.

Please take some time to look through these books. Note the title and slant of many of the articles. Also, be aware that some of the pictures depict and even advocate behavior that God condemns. I look forward to the opportunity to help students develop as Christian leaders through tearing down the enemy's strongholds of rhetoric, deceptive language, and outright lies, but I do not want to do this without you clearly understanding that these textbooks are often antagonist towards Christian belief and practice.

Once you have looked through the books, and understand what I am asking, please sign this form indicating that you completely support allowing your child to read this material for analysis in class.

Please also consider committing to pray for these students on a regular basis. The kind of godly thinking that we want to encourage in these students does not come from man.
